<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Generalize</b>- To make a statement or form an opinion based on a few facts or examples and what they have in common</li> <li>• <b>Compare</b> – To find the similarities or differences between two or more people or things</li> <li>• <b>Contrast</b> – To show differences when compared</li> <li>• <b>Infer</b> – To form an opinion based on information you have</li> <li>• <b>Integrate</b> – To add or include parts to make a whole</li> <li>• <b>Adapt</b> – To change something to fit new situations</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Aud:</b> <i>To hear</i></li> <li>• <b>Vis:</b> <i>To see</i></li> <li>• <b>Audience</b> – A group of people who hear or listen to a presentation</li> <li>• <b>Auditorium</b> – A large room in which to hear a presentation</li> <li>• <b>Audible</b> – Loud enough to be heard</li> <li>• <b>Audiologist</b> – A health care person who has studied the sense of hearing and related disorders to hearing</li> <li>• <b>Applaud</b> – To show approval by clapping one’s hand together in order to be heard</li> <li>• <b>Vision</b> – The ability to see</li> <li>• <b>Supervisor</b> – The person who oversees employees</li> <li>• <b>Visitor</b> – A person who stops to see someone or something</li> <li>• <b>Audiovisual</b> – Using both sight and sound, typically in the form of slides or video and recorded speech or music</li> <li>• <b>Revise</b> – To see something again for the purpose of possibly making changes to it</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Spect</b>— <i>to look at</i></li> <li>• <b>Form</b>— <i>shape</i></li> <li>• <b>Perspective</b> – One way of looking at things</li> <li>• <b>Retrospect</b> – Contemplation or thinking of the past; the action of looking back at past events</li> <li>• <b>Spectator</b> – A person who watches something</li> <li>• <b>Prospect</b> – The possibility or likelihood of some future event occurring</li> <li>• <b>Aspect</b> – Something to be considered or looked over</li> <li>• <b>Conform</b> – To behave or think in agreement with a rule or standard</li> <li>• <b>Deformed</b> – Not having the normal or natural shape; misshapen</li> <li>• <b>Format</b> – A structure, plan, or arrangement for how something is presented</li> <li>• <b>Formation</b> – The action of being created; an arrangement of something</li> <li>• <b>Reform</b> – To give another shape or appearance; to arrange again; to make over or improve</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Gress</b>— <i>to go</i></li> <li>• <b>Rupt</b>— <i>to break</i></li> <li>• <b>Regress</b> – To go back or move backward</li> <li>• <b>Digress</b> – To go away from the main topic; to wander in thoughts or ideas</li> <li>• <b>Egress</b> – NOUN—an exit; VERB—to go out of or leave</li> <li>• <b>Congress</b> – The act of coming together; an encounter; a meeting</li> <li>• <b>Ingress</b> – A place or means of access; an entrance</li> <li>• <b>Erupt</b> – To explode; to break out with force</li> <li>• <b>Rupture</b> – To burst or break open</li> <li>• <b>Abrupt</b> – Sudden or unexpected; broken into what is expected</li> <li>• <b>Bankrupt</b> – To be out of money</li> <li>• <b>Corrupt</b> – Evil or dishonest; to break away from honesty</li> </ul>

**Week 9**

- **Tract** — *to draw or pull*
- **Ten/Tain** — *end, limit*
- **Detract** - to diminish or decrease in value or opinion because of a flaw, mannerism, or characteristic
- **Extract** - to pull or take something out
- **Protract** - lasting for a long time or longer than expected
- **Intractable** - hard to control or deal with
- **Abstract** - to remove something
- **Abstain** - to hold back from an activity by choice
- **Detain** - To keep from proceeding
- **Patent** - Exclusive right of ownership
- **Tentative** - Uncertain; hesitant; not fully agreed upon
- **Traction** - To have grip or the ability to move or drag something

**Week 10**

- **Fract**—*to break*
- **Flect/Flex**—*to bend*
- **Infraction** - The act of breaking the limits or rules
- **Fractious** - Difficult to control; unruly; grumpy
- **Refract** - To bend light so that it looks like it is broken
- **Fracture** - The cracking or breaking of a hard object or material
- **Fractal** - A geometric shape that looks the same no matter what size it is (like a snowflake)
- **Flexible** - Capable of bending without breaking
- **Deflect** - To turn or move to one side; to swerve
- **Reflective** - Thoughtful; capable of reflecting or throwing back light
- **Circumflex** - To bend around or curve
- **Genuflect** - To bend one's knee to the ground as a sign of respect or worship
