- Generalize- To make a statement or form an opinion based on a few facts or examples and what they have in common
- Compare To find the similarities or differences between two or more people or things
- **Contrast** To show differences when compared
- **Infer** To form an opinion based on information you have
- Integrate To add or include parts to make a whole
- Adapt To change something to fit new situations

- **Aerospace** The atmosphere and the space beyond; Industry of air/space travel
- **Aerodynamics** Branch of science that studies the movement of air and the way that objects move through air
- **Aerial** Existing, happening, or operating in the air
- Aeronautics The science or art of flight
- **Aerosol** A gaseous suspension of fine solid or liquid particles
- **Astronaut** A person trained to command, pilot, or serve as a crew member of a spacecraft
- **Astronomy** The scientific study of stars, planets, and other objects in outer space
- **Asterisk** A small star-like symbol (*) used to reference an annotation
- **Astrodome** A transparent dome in the upper surface of an aircraft used for astronomical observations
- Asteroid A rocky mass that orbits the sun

- **Memoir** An account of the author's personal experiences
- **Memento** Something kept as a reminder of a past event; a souvenir
- **Memorandum** A note, reminder

- **Designate** To appoint someone to a specific position
- Insignia A distinguishing mark or token of something
- **Signal** A gesture to call attention
- **Signature** The name of a person written in a distinctive way
- **Significance** The quality of being worthy of attention; importance

- **Evacuate** To remove from a place of danger to a safe place
- Vacant Not filled; empty
- **Vacillate** To alternate or waiver between different opinions or actions; to be indecisive

- Vacuum A space entirely devoid of matter
- **Mobile** Able to move or be moved freely or easily
- Motive A reason for doing something, especially one that is hidden or not obvious
- **Demote** To give a lower rank or less senior position, usually as punishment
- Immobile Not moving; motionless
- **Promotion** To move to a higher position; advancement

- Accreditation The act of granting credit or recognition
- **Credential** A document or certificate proving a person's quality or qualifications
- **Credible** Able to be believed; convincing
- **Discredit** To injure the credit or reputation of
- Incredulous Unwilling or unable to believe something

- **Corporation** A company or group of people authorized to act as a single entity
- Corporal Of or relating to the human body
- **Corps** A branch of a military organization assigned to a particular kind of work
- Corpulent Large or bulky of body; fat
- **Incorporate** To take in or contain (something) as part of a whole; include
- **Democracy** Control of an organization or group by the majority of its members
- **Demographic** The statistical data of a population, especially those showing average age, income, education, etc.
- **Demagogue** A political leader who seeks support by appealing to popular desires and making false claims
